Meditation of the Week: Psalm 91:1-16  
Text: Romans 11:33-12:2  
Title: **Reasonable Worship to God**

The apostle Paul testified that no one can fathom the riches of God's wisdom and knowledge, and that there is no one who knows His thoughts and has no counselors for Him.

Realizing that all things come out of Him and return to Him through Him, and he testifies that who will give to Him first and receive it back, and the glory will be to Him forever. Amen. He testified.

He exhorted the brothers who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ:

**"I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service."**(Romans 12:1)

Of course, when children gather to worship God on the first day of the week, it is also a matter of offering their bodies, but it is saying that offering their bodies as living sacrifices is reasonable service.

The word to offer our bodies as a living sacrifice is something that no one in the world can ask of us, but only God can ask of us.

There is no greater love than when a man lays down his life for his friends, and Jesus told his disciples that if you do what I command, you will be my friends, and that Jesus would give up his life for them.

When the time came, Jesus walked to the cross and offered Himself as a living sacrifice by laying His body on the cross. He offered the body of God as a living sacrifice for the sinners of the world.

This is why the apostle Paul is exhorting all Christians.  
**" ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service ."**

He who offered His own body as a living sacrifice for us sinners is telling us to offer our bodies as a living sacrifice to God the Father, just as He offered His body as a living sacrifice to God the Father.

The apostle Paul testified about the giving of God through a living sacrifice:

**" And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God."**(Romans 12:2)

The Apostle John testified of the things of the world:

**" Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.**

**16 For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world.**

**17 And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever.**

**18 Little children, it is the last time: and as ye have heard that antichrist shall come, even now are there many antichrists; whereby we know that it is the last time.**

**19 They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would no doubt have continued with us: but they went out, that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us."(1 John 2:15-20)**

However, most Christians today consider service to come to the chapel on Sundays and worship God for an hour or two, listen to sermons, and share fellowship with the saints.

Jesus was despised and rejected by the people, and he became a man of sorrow and a man of grievances, and he was despised and respected by no one. Indeed, even though He bore our grievances and caused our

sorrows, we thought that He was punished and suffered by God. He was wounded by our humble, he was bruised by our iniquity, and he was disciplined for our peace, and we were healed by his scourge. He offered His body as a living sacrifice to the Father, so that He could worship properly for us (Isaiah 53:3-5).

Through today's message, we should realize our wrong thoughts about service, repent thoroughly, and decide to worship before God properly.
