Meditation of the Week: Psalm 91:1-16  
Text: Hebrews 12:18-29

Title: **The Shaky Kingdoms of the World and the Unshakable Kingdom of God**

When God came down to Mount Sinai to give the law to the Israelites, Mount Sinai was set on fire, and they heard the fearful voice of God in the darkness, storm, and the sound of God's trumpet. God said through Moses in advance:

**"And the Lord said unto Moses, Go unto the people, and sanctify them to day and to morrow, and let them wash their clothes,**

**<sup>11</sup> And be ready against the third day: for the third day the Lord will come down in the sight of all the people upon mount Sinai."(Exodus 19:10-11)**

God told Moses in advance that God would come down and establish an unshakable and eternal kingdom on earth for the Israelites when the second thousand years (two days) passed and the third thousand years, that is, the seventh day, after two thousand years (two days) of the Age of Grace.

The apostle Paul testified to the Hebrews who believed in the Lord Jesus Christ that they no longer had to go to Mount Sinai, but that they were now reaching Mount Zion in heaven, and unto the city of the living God was Jerusalem in heaven, and to an innumerable company of angels, to the general assembly and church of the

firstborn written in heaven, that God the Judge of all things, the spirits of the righteous who were perfected, Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and that the blood sprinkling that speaketh better thing than that of Abel. . And then His voice shook the earth, and now He promised to say, 'Once again I will not only be on earth but also He testified that even the heavens would be shaken.

As for the meaning of this phrase "**once again**," he testified that it was to remove the shaky things that have already been created and leave the unshakable. He also testified that we would receive an unshakable kingdom. He testified that all the nations of the world that have been built on the sand will be destroyed by the fire of God, which is the fire that destroys them, and that only the kingdom of God built on the rock will remain on the earth forever.

The apostle Peter testified about the day of judgment, when the extinguishing fire removes all shaking things from heaven and earth:

**"Knowing this first, that there shall come in the last days scoffers, walking after their own lusts,**

**<sup>4</sup> And saying, Where is the promise of his coming? for since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation.**

**<sup>5</sup> For this they willingly are ignorant of, that by the word of God the heavens were of old, and the earth standing out of the water and in the water:**

**<sup>6</sup> Whereby the world that then was, being overflowed with water, perished:**

**<sup>7</sup> But the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men.”(2 Peter 3:3-7)**

Also, through the apostle Paul, God said, **"Once again I will shake not only the earth but also the heavens.** Foreseeing the fulfillment of what he said, the apostle Peter testified that it would be fulfilled when the day of the Lord came:

**" But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up.**

**<sup>11</sup> Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness,**

**<sup>12</sup> Looking for and hasting unto the coming of the day of God, wherein the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat?**

**<sup>13</sup> Nevertheless we, according to his promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness.**

**<sup>14</sup> Wherefore, beloved, seeing that ye look for such things, be diligent that ye may be found of him in peace, without spot, and blameless.**

**<sup>15</sup> And account that the longsuffering of our Lord is salvation; even as our**

**beloved brother Paul also according to the wisdom given unto him hath written unto you;**

**..." (2 Peter 3:10-15)**

The apostle Paul exhorted his children in the last days:

**"Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord:**

**<sup>15</sup> Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble you, and thereby many be defiled;**

**<sup>16</sup> Lest there be any fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one morsel of meat sold his birthright.”(Hebrews 12:14-16)**

Although we still live in the sinful world, spiritually our spirit has risen up with the Lord Jesus Christ and seated us together in heaven in Christ Jesus (Ephesians 2:6)

Therefore, in the Holy Spirit, we have come to Mount Zion in heaven, Jerusalem in heaven, the city of the living God, countless angels, the general assembly and church of the firstborn recorded in heaven, God who is the Judge of all things, the spirits of the righteous who have been perfected, Jesus who is the mediator of the new covenant, and the blood that speaks of something better than the blood of Abel.

All the kingdoms like sand castles that have been built on the world through the Principalities, the rulers of the darkness of the world, and the evil spirits on high for the past six thousand years will all be

destroyed by the judgment of God, who  
shakes the heavens and the earth with fire.  
At this time, our Lord Jesus Christ will  
come as the King of kings and the Lord of  
lords and establish His unshakable  
kingdom.
